

SHABBIR TILES AND CERAMICS LIMITED DIRECTORS' REPORT TO THE SHAREHOLDERS FOR THE FIRST QUARTER ENDED SEPTEMBER 30, 2019

The Directors of your Company presents to you the financial results of your Company for the first quarter ended September 30, 2019.

BUSINESS CHALLENGES AND FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

Currently, the construction industry and the connected sectors such as steel, cement, tiles sectors, are all undergoing a slowdown owed to the financial and commercial challenges being handled by the economy.

There was also significant disturbance to the trade, post budget 2019. A major negative change for our business was the addition of tiles in the 3rd schedule of the Sales Tax Act 1990, whereby sales tax is now levied on the retail price, irrespective of the sales value. This places an additional burden to us in terms of complexity and cost.

Together with the challenges arising from the drive for documenting on largely undocumented dealers and retailers these factors had an overall negative impact on the purchasing power of the trade and general consumers and resulted in a contraction of the market.

The rise in gas tariff by 30% in October 2018 was followed by another 31% increase from July 2019 combining to a cumulative increase of 70% in a span of less than ten months. Energy, being one of the highest contributors of the total manufacturing cost disrupted the margins significantly.

Devaluation impacted the costs of imported materials and consumables. In addition, the imposition of axle load restrictions in absence of a proper road infrastructure master plan and a transportation regulatory body has significantly raised costs of inland transportation of both raw material and finished goods.

During the quarter net sales recorded were higher by 7%, despite a slowdown in the market, but owing to major increases in manufacturing input costs, the gross profit decreased by 38%. Overall the business incurred a significant operating loss before tax of Rs. 115.291 million during the first quarter of the fiscal year as against a profit of Rs. 93.390 million in the comparative period last year.

FUTURE OUTLOOK

The economy continues to face challenges in several areas including inflation, and the documentation drive to broaden the tax net.

The tile market size has been impacted due to reduced construction activities. Additionally, smuggling from neighboring countries has also increased and is impacting volumes.

On a combined basis the cost pressures and market factors pose a significant challenge for our business. However, we foresee construction activities gradually returning to normal by the end of next quarter which should uplift the tile demand. We are strongly focusing on improving manufacturing efficiency & product quality and also in enlarging our market presence. There is emphasis on brand development and preserving and developing association with our customers and engagements with architects and other opinion leaders.

We trust that the Government will provide stability to the business environment and generate a stimulus to growth in the construction sector which is critical to overall economic growth.

We also take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders including our staff for their continued support and commitment to the Company.

آپ کی کمپنی کے ڈائریکٹرز 30 ستمبر ، 2019 کو ختم ہونے والی پہلی سہ ماہی میں کمپنی کے مالی نتائج پیش کرتے ہیں۔

کاروباری چیلنجز اور مالی کارکردگی

فی الحال ، تعمیراتی صنعت اور منسلک شعبوں جیسے اسٹیل ، سیمنٹ ، ٹائل سیکٹر ، معیشت کو مالی اور تجارتی چیلنجوں کی وجہ سے سست روی کا شکار ہیں۔

بجٹ 2019 کے بعد تجارت میں بھی خاصہ خلل پڑا ہے ۔ ہمارے کاروبار کے لئے ایک بڑی منفی تبدیلی سیلز ٹیکس ایکٹ 1990 کے تیسرے شیڈول میں ٹائلز کا اضافہ تھا جس کے تحت قطع نظر قیمت فروخت کے، خوردہ قیمت پر سیلز ٹیکس عائد کیا جاتا ہے۔ اس کی وجہ سے پیچیدگی اور لاگت کے معاملے میں ہم پر ایک اضافی بوجھ پڑا ہے۔

اس کے ساتھ، بڑے پیمانے پر غیر دستاویزی ڈیلروں اور ریٹیلرذ کی دستاویزات کا جو چیلنج درپیش ہے، ان عوامل کا تجارت اور عام صارفین کی خریداری کی طاقت پر مجموعی طور پر منفی اثر پڑا اور اس کے نتیجے میں مارکیٹ میں تناؤ پیدا ہوا ہے ۔

اکتوبر 2018 میں گیس کے نرخوں میں 30 فیصد اضافہ ہوا ہے جس کے بعد جولائی 2019 سے مزید 31 فیصد اضافہ ہوا جس سے دس ماہ سے بھی کم عرصے میں مجموعی 70 فیصد کا اضافہ ہوا ہے ۔ توانائی کی لاگت، جو کمپنی کی کل تیاری لاگت کا کافی زیادہ حصہ ہے۔ اس نے کمپنی کے مجموعی منافع کو نمایاں طور پر متاثر کیا ہے ۔

مارکیٹ میں سست روی کے باوجود سہ ماہی کے دوران خالص فروخت میں پچھلے سال کی پہلی سہ ماہی کے مقابلے میں 7 فیصد اضافہ ریکارڈ کیا گیا ہے ، لیکن تیاری لاگت میں بڑے اضافے کی وجہ سے ، مجموعی منافع میں 38 فیصد کمی واقع ہوئی ہے ۔ مجموعی طور پر کمپنی کو پہلی سہ ماہی میں قبل از ٹیکس 115.291 ملین روپے کا نقصان ہوا ہے جبکہ پچھلے سال کی پہلی سہ ماہی میں 93.390 ملین روپے کا منافع ہوا تھا ۔

1. THE COMPANY AND ITS OPERATIONS

2. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting which comprise of International Accounting Standard (IAS) 34 - 'Interim Financial Reporting', issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) as notified under the Companies Act, 2017 (the "Act") and provisions of and directives issued under the Act. Where the provisions of and directives issued under the Act differ with the requirement of IAS 34, the provisions of and directives issued under the Act have been followed.

3. BASIS OF PREPARATION

- **3.1** These condensed interim financial statements are un-audited and do not include all the information and disclosures required in the annual financial statements, and should be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements of the Company for the year ended June 30, 2019.
- **3.2** These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, unless otherwise specially stated.
- **3.3** These condensed interim financial statements are presented in Pakistan Rupees which is the Company's functional and presentation currency.

4. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies and methods of computation adopted in the preparation of these condensed interim financial statements are consistent with those followed in the preparation of the Company's annual financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2019.

It also requires management to exercise its judgment in the process of applying the Company's accounting policies. Estimates and judgments are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised and in any future periods affected.

Judgements and estimates made by the management in the preparation of these condensed interim financial statements are the same as those applied in the Company's annual financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2019.

The Company's financial risk management objectives and policies are consistent with those disclosed in the financial statements as at and for the year ended June 30, 2019.

10. LONG-TERM FINANCING

Represents diminishing musharaka facility amounting to Rs. 1,000 million (June 2019: Rs.1000) under islamic banking terms which carries markup at rate of three months KIBOR + 0.70% per annum, payable quarterly with two years grace period. The facility is secured against first pari passu mortgage and hypothecation over all present and future fixed assets (Land, building, plant and machinery). The loan is repayable within five years in ten equal semi annual installments commencing from February 2020.
